AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 08-003-CJ

Admission to Practice Before the Tribal Courts

Section 1. Eligibility

- A. Any attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Michigan, or in any other state, and who is in good standing with their respective bar association is eligible to practice law in the Nottawaseppi Huron Band Tribal Court. If an attorney has been convicted or under investigation for any crime involving fraud, theft, misrepresentation, misappropriation or dishonesty that attorney may not apply for admission to practice until the investigation or sentence is completed.
- B. Prior to admission to practice, an attorney shall:
 - 1) File an *Application for Admission to Practice* with the Tribal Court Administrator.
 - 2) Pay the required Admission to Practice Fee.
 - 3) Take the *Oath of Office*.

Section 2. Order

- A. The Tribal Court Administrator shall prepare:
 - 1) An *Application for Admission to Practice* form;
 - 2) A *Certificate of Admission to Practice*; and
 - 3) A suitable *Oath of Office*.
- B. Upon request, the Court Administrator shall furnish an *Application for Admission to Practice* form and the *Oath of Office* form.
- C. The requesting attorney shall fill out and appropriately sign both forms. Upon return of the forms to the Court Administrator, the Chief Judge shall issue a *Certificate of Admission to Practice* if the above requirements are met.

This Administrative Order was initially adopted on February 26, 2008. The present language was adopted by amendment on July 29, 2009 to prevent applicants, who are under investigation, or serving a sentence for any crime involving conduct as enumerated in Section 1.A, from becoming members of the Tribal Bar while under investigation or serving a sentence for the above-referenced crimes.
