CHIEF MOGUAGO SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION GUIDELINES

In honor of John Moguago, the tribal chief who escaped forced removal and returned to settle along the Pine Creek in Calhoun County, Michigan, the Nottawaseppi Huron Band of Potawatomi offers a scholarship to an academically eligible student attending an accredited college or university. This purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial support to a student who shows outstanding academic performance and to motivate academic excellence at the college level. To be eligible for this scholarship an applicant must:

- Be a tribal member of the Nottawaseppi Huron Band of Potawatomi, with current enrollment information on file.
- Provide proof of enrollment or registration at an accredited college or university.
- Have a minimum 3.00 GPA and provide an **official** high school, GED, or college transcript (whichever is **most recent**) as proof.
- Submit the Chief Moguago Scholarship Application by **June 30th**, of **each year**.
- Include one (1) current Letter of Recommendation from someone aware of the student's scholastic, career, and leadership abilities such as: instructor, counselor, advisor, former employer, or community leader. The following criteria for the recommendation should be:
 - a. academic accomplishment
 - b. personal character
 - c. leadership qualities
 - d. Community involvement

AWARD PROCESS

Processing of award(s) is scheduled for July via a scoring rubric. After August 1st, applicants will be advised in writing of their award status. The Education Committee shall over-see this scholarship and it will be administered by the Education Department of the Nottawaseppi Huron Band of Potawatomi.
