What to recycle & how

	<p>Msenegen</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <u>Paper</u> (newspaper, magazines, office paper, post-its, color & gloss OK) -REMOVE staples, stickers, plastic windows etc.
	<p>Mkekwen</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <u>Boxes</u> (cardboard, dry food boxes, corrugated, etc. OK) -REMOVE plastic windows, stickers, tape (e.g. any thing that isn't cardboard) -COLLAPSE boxes (take large boxes to outdoor bin)
	<p>Modésnen</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <u>Bottles (plastic)</u> #1, #2, #3, #4, #5 & #7 (clear & color OK) look for number inside of arrows on bottom of container -REMOVE labels & lids -RINSE CLEAN -CRUSH
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <u>Glass</u> food & beverage bottles/jars (clear, green, & brown OK) -REMOVE labels & lids -RINSE CLEAN
	<p>Biwabkwen</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <u>Metals</u> (food & beverage containers) -RINSE CLEAN & REMOVE lids -FLATTEN /STORE sharp lids inside of flattened cans
